Dear Parent/Carer,

Further to my previous letter, I am writing to inform you of a change to the arrangements for students this week. In order to provide bespoke revision for their remaining exams, there has been a rescheduling of timetabled lessons.

Unless your son or daughter has an exam on Thursday the 14TH June, they will not need to be in the Academy and will therefore revise at home. Those students sitting the Child Development exam in the morning will need to be in for 8.35am and meet in the Sports Hall for 8.45am for a briefing as normal. If they haven't got an exam in the afternoon, they will be free to leave the Academy after the exam has ended (approximately 10.30 am). Those students who have the Food and Nutrition exam in the afternoon, will need to be in the Academy for 12.30pm. Any student taking an exam on Thursday will need to enter the building via the main reception where they will be asked to electronically sign in.

Any student, who does not have an exam on Thursday, may choose to work in the LRC completing independent revision if they feel that this would be of benefit. If this is the case, the student must sign in and out via reception as outlined above.

All Year 11 will take a Physics exam on the morning of Friday 15th June; students need to report to the Sports Hall for a briefing by 8.45am. As indicated earlier, students will be free to leave after the exam, with the exception of Miss Stott's German class who will leave at 12.20pm after a revision session.

All students will need to wear full school uniform whilst in school. Furthermore, if you have any text books or other resources e.g. library books, belonging to the Academy, please encourage your son or daughter to hand these in at reception or the KS4 Pod before they leave on Friday.

I also wish to take this opportunity to thank you for supporting your child throughout the examination season. We appreciate it may have felt like a marathon but the finishing line is in sight and we are really pleased with the positive, settled and mature attitude Year 11 have shown.
